Nathaniel George, dec'd

Upon the petition of John George (with his attorney A. W. Foster) setting forth that Nathaniel George late of the Borough of Greensburgh, deceased by his last will and testament devised a certain lot of ground with the house thereon erected in which said Nathaniel resided at the time of making his said last will & testament and situated in the Borough of Greensburgh to said John George in fee and also a certain lot contiguous to said Borough containing about five acres being the same which he purchased from John Smith and also made certain pecuniary bequests as in & by said last will & testament he says will appear - also representing that the said house and lot and also said out lot has been sold and sold by virtue of executions issued on judgments obtained against the executor of said Nathaniel George and the proceeds of the same appropriated in place of the personal estate of said Nathaniel George - That John Morrison, Esquire, lately deceased, the acting executor of said last will and testament has settled his administrators account by which it appears upon said settlement a balance remained in his hands at the time of settlement of nine hundred and ninety nine dollars and eighty two cents - and therefore praying the Court to order and decree that the same with interest thereon from said time be paid over to said John George in lieu of the proceeds of said sales of town and contributions for the loss he has sustained by the loss of said house & lot & out lot & by the said
