Sometimes, neither can I, but I am thrilled to be one of those rare people who has met 10th and 11th cousins. We all share an old heritage. Even without known royal ancestors, we can trace our family back more than 250 years.

Please try to come to the 1991 reunion. We have much to do up here in Northern California. We're a long way from Disneyland and the hot, sunny beaches of Southern California, but we have our own rugged, mysterious, romantic, and sea-life laden beaches. We have the Redwood Forests, famous wineries (like Korbel, Sebastiani, Charles Krug, Christian Brothers, Simi, and even the Smothers Brothers' own winery) and several California missions. We have the dream house of early 1900's writer Jack London (<u>Call of the Wild</u>), Luther Burbank's Gardens, Charles Shultz's (Snoopy and Peanuts) ice arena and museum, and Ripley's Believe It or Not Museum in the Church Built from One Tree. For further fun, we have Victorian neighborhood walking tours, cheese factories, hot air balloon rides, hot or mineral springs, mud baths, glider rides, a petrified forest and an old faithful geyser. In Santa Rosa we're close to San Francisco, Sacramento, and Sonoma (the site of the original Bear Flag Revolution and General Vallejo's house). Some activities like glider or hot air balloon rides may require reservations, so let me know what you are interested in. Call For Corrections and Additions

Updates

Update pages of Book 1 and Book 2 should be available by the time of the reunion. You will be able to remove old pages from the current book and replace them with new or corrected pages. Costs should run between \$5-\$15, depending on the number of additions and corrections received. Some major revisions will be done to Book 1. Reprints

Several people have asked if additional copies

of Book 1 and Book 2 were available. Both books were sold out soon after printing. However, if there is enough interest, they can be reprinted. The more printed at a time, the less the cost. Because of the increased mailing and printing costs, we have increased dues to eight dollars per family per year. You will receive all the family newsletters and information about the reunions. If we can find an editor, we would like to start a regular newsletter even on years when we do not have a reunion. In the past, newsletter were mailed out to everyone on the list, but because of increased expenses, the newsletter will only be sent to members. We will gladly accept donations beyond that amount to be used for research or for the cemetery fund.
