

# The 1995 Berks County Pennsylvania Reunion

The 1995 Sauvage/Sowash/Soash Family Reunion was held at the Holiday Inn in Reading, PA. on June 30, July 1 & 2. On Friday morning, the group traveled to Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church (formerly known as Mertz Church) where Heinrich Sowasch married Anna Esther Schneider on 27 Nov 1749. This was the son of Johannes H. Sauvage, the original immigrant. The group was able to view the original church book which recorded their marriage. The book also records the baptism of Johanna Elisabeth Sawash, born 13 Jan 1751 and baptized 26 Jan 1751. This was probably their first child. No other records have been found in the church record books to date. Church members also provided a brief history of the chruch and the region and then served refreshments.

The group then headed west about two miles to the land that Johannes H. Sauvage purchased on 20 March 1743. Amazingly, the present tract of land retains basically the same shape as it did when Johannes purchased it (see map p. 3). Just before Johannes' death, the land went to Heinrich who owned the land until the late 1780's when he sold it and moved to Westmoreland County, PA. Some plat maps show a cemetery on the property, but it was vacated about 1865. This cemetery may have been the burial site of Johannes Sauvage and his wife Susannah.

At one o'clock, the group met at the Berks County Courthouse to hear Michelle Lynch, Presevation Specialist for Berks County, speak on early Berks County, especially Rockland Township and what life would have been like when the family lived in the county. The group then viewed the original German will of Johannes H. Sowas, dated 16 Feb 1761 and proved 11 May 1761. Johannes made his mark, which appears to be **J H S**. Also still in the court records are the estate papers which list the items he owned and their value. It was indeed a remarkable experience that we were looking at the very paper that Johannes signed 234 years ago.

An excellent dinner was served at the Holiday Inn, followed by the craft auction. The auction raised \$339.25 for the project fund (see the list of donors and purchasers p. 4)

On Saturday, the group headed to Philadelphia on a tour arranged by Merwin, where they visited the Liberty Bell, Independence Hall, Christ Church, and Penn's Landing where Johannes & family probably first landed in America on 05 Sep 1738. Lunch and shopping were next at the Reading Terminal market before going to the Philadelphia Museum of Art.

The Saturday evening meal was followed by the annual business meeting. Merwin welcomed everyone. Jane Brown won the 50/50 raffle, with the proceeds going to the project fund.

Richard Soash reported on the cemetery projects. The stone for Susana Sowash (2C/W) and several of her descendants has been installed at St.Clair Cemetery in

Greensburg, PA. The stone of Michael and David Sowash (1F1F & 1F1E) in Brush Creek Cemetery in Irwin, PA. is currently being reset after it was broken. The group discussed engraving a large family plot marker stone at Union Cemetery in Irwin with the names of George and Elizabeth (Bankart) Sowash (1J). The cost of putting two smaller stones in the cemetery would be \$1440. Moving, cleaning and engraving the plot marker stone would cost a total of \$744.20. Joan Sowash agreed to contact some family members in the Greensburg area to see how they felt. The group also discussed putting a marker on the original land of Johannes H. Sauvage/Sowash. Maxine Cornwell suggested attaching a bronze plate to a stone, which gave Rockland Township its name. Richard will investigate the possibility with the current owner of the land.

John Hamilton suggested that the group try to erect stones at Brush Creek Cemetery in Irwin for Daniel Sowash (2) and his father Henry/Heinrich Sowash, both veterans of the Revolutionary War, since the Dept. of Veterans Affairs will provide new stones. Richard will investigate the option with Brush Creek Cemetery.

After a long discussion on how often to hold reunions, it was decided to hold reunions every year. Every third year, the reunion would return to Pennsylvania, probably either Westmoreland or Berks Counties, although other sites may also be possible. These reunions would emphasize the history of our family. The reunions in other years would be spread geographically across the United States to allow people to attend more easily. These reunions will tend to be social reunions rather than family history reunions.

The 1996 Sauvage/Sowash/Soash Family Reunion will be held 19, 20, 21 July 1996 in Grand Island, Nebraska. It will be hosted by Charles & Edith Soash and Hugh & Catharine Miner. A postcard will be sent to all names on the mailing list in January 1996 with a second letter sent to those who join the association. The 1997 reunion will be hosted by Elinor Parish and Ruth Thomas in the northern Ohio area. The 1998 History Reunion will be held in Greensburg, PA. We need a host for this reunion. Any volunteers? We will be looking for hosts for the 1999 reunions, perhaps in northern or western United States. Please consider hosting a get-together.

The oldest member attending was Nellie Soash (1F6C4/W/) at 88. The oldest male attending was William Harold Sowash (2C1B1A2) at age 85. Amanda Sowash (1J7E4A2B) was the youngest attendee at age nine. Maxine (Soash) and Robert Cornwell (1F6C4A) had traveled the greatest distance from California.
